- Write one essay on Topic #1 and Topic #2. Make sure to put the essays in your application packet.
- Do not handwrite the essays, but use a computer instead. All essays should be double-spaced.

<Topic #1 > 300 words or fewer

We are partly a product of the environments in which we were raised. Describe your family, home, neighborhood, or community, and explain how it has shaped you as a person. This essay is a chance to tell your story as simple or as complex as it may be. Think of it as your chance to speak your mind respectfully, clearly, and honestly, and in so doing, allowing us to know the "real you."

<Topic #2 > 400 - 700 words

TCU's motto—"Stand in the Gap: Christ's Peace in Broken Places"—captures the university's aim to equip students for perceptively and effectively mediating Christ's redemption wherever brokenness has shattered relationships between God and humanity and within human societies.

Considering this concept, please write an essay integrating your answers to the following questions:

- 1 What is one area of brokenness in the world for which you are particularly burdened?
- 2 Why should the church be concerned about this particular "gap"?
- 3 What perspectives, behaviors, attitudes, skills, resources, etc., do you think Christians need in order to address this brokenness?
- 4 In what ways do you hope an education at TCU will better equip you to "stand in the gap"?

<Notes>

We have several goals for these essays. We want to get to know you as well as possible. We want to see the level of your English ability. We want to see how well you can analyze an issue and how well you can organize your written discussion of that issue. The essays will be evaluated according to their organization, clarity of thought, depth of insight, grammar, spelling, punctuation, and maturity of style.

You are expected to compose each essay by yourself, without any help from any other person. This means that you should use your own words. For the second essay, you may refer to outside sources, but you should make every effort to paraphrase other people's ideas/information in your own words. If you do find it necessary to use someone else's words—that is, if you need to copy one or two phrases or sentences word for word—"you must put those copied words inside double quotation marks, as done here in this sentence." But whether you paraphrase or quote someone directly, you should cite any print and/or online references where you found someone else's ideas and/or information. Failure to do so could result in your disqualification for admission to TCU. Besides outside informational sources, you may also use a dictionary, Bible, spelling checker, and the like. But the essays should reflect your own ability and thoughts.
