From this perspective, please summarize your thoughts about the following questions in an essay of at least 900 words but no more than 1,100 words.

1. Consider the "gaps" close to you, in greater society, and around the world. What is a "gap" (an area of brokenness) for which you are particularly burdened? Why?
2. Christ is both the reason and the model for Christians to stand in the gap. How do you see this call to stand in the gap as your own calling, and what do you think about the biblical perspectives and attitudes, practical means and actions, and cooperative relationships necessary for servants of Christ to fulfill this calling?
3. In what ways do you hope an education at TCU will better equip you to "stand in the gap"?
